
We take our name from the local artist L.S. Lowry, who is famous for paintings that capture scenes of industrial England.

The Lowry Academy is a popular 11-16 school in Little Hulton, Salford, and is part of United Learning Trust, the largest multi-academy trust in the UK.

Year 7 Baseline Assessments

Upon joining The Lowry Academy your child will undertake a number of baseline assessments that will allow us to complete ability-based setting in all subjects with the aim of ensuring all students make excellent progress. The lessons will be arranged over a two-week timetable and consist of an exciting range of subjects.

Annual Assessments and Reporting

Throughout your child's time at The Lowry Academy, assessment of their progress within each subject will be regular throughout each of their normal lessons with teachers adapting their planning accordingly to best support their progress. At key points during the year, usually January and June, a series of formal assessments will take place both within lessons and the examinations hall to provide a formal recognition of the progress they are making. Your child's Year Group Position will be reported compared to their position on entry providing you with key information as to their progress compared to that of their peers.

Education with Character

We are proud of our commitment to deliver outstanding Education with Character. We aim to develop character, compassion, and service. Throughout their time at The Lowry Academy, students are expected to contribute to our school community and to society. We want students to try things they cannot do, to persist in the face of difficulty, and to become resilient in overcoming obstacles.

ASPIRE, Our Co-Curricular Programme

We provide a wide range of opportunities and experiences that seek to help our students become confident, well-rounded, and aspiring individuals. Our curriculum and co-curricular programmes are overflowing with opportunities to try something new and develop new skills. Students are encouraged to choose from a wide range of over 60 school clubs which take place at lunch times and after school - there is something for everyone!

As part of our whole school initiative to provide a rich and varied curriculum to all students, we encourage all students to participate in at least one after-school or lunchtime activity per week earning themselves credits towards certificates and badges along the way. Additionally, taking part in clubs will help students make new friends and build key life skills like teamwork and resilience whilst having a lot of fun. These skills and experiences will make our students 'stand out from the crowd' when applying for college and university too.

Visits and Enrichment

In addition to our broad range of co-curricular clubs, our students enjoy trips across the country, university visits, talks by inspirational speakers from the worlds of medicine, law, and business as well as countless opportunities to collaborate with their peers at other United Learning schools.

Student Leadership

We believe that well-rounded students make a highly positive, tangible contribution to the life of the school and wider community. Our student leadership team is elected democratically through a process of elections at the beginning of the academic year. The student leadership team has supported a wide range of activities key to ensuring that students' views are sought and drawn upon in decisions relevant to their own experience of school. This group of young people is articulate, enthusiastic, aspirational for themselves and others.

Careers

The Lowry Academy is dedicated to ensuring our students have meaningful encounters at school which prepare them for their working lives. Careers education is delivered across all subject areas as well as PSHE. In addition, we offer a range of activities and experiences which aim to give our students a full understanding of post-16 opportunities.

These include:

Form time activities | Enrichment days | Careers fairs | University visits | Mock interviews | College visits | Employer events | University mentoring | Inspirational guest speakers | Presentations from colleges/apprenticeship providers/employers.

We have a designated careers department with a full time qualified L6 Careers Adviser and Senior Leader for Careers.

House System

When students start at The Lowry Academy, they are assigned to a House. We have four distinct Houses — Delaney, Kingsley, Turing and Pankhurst — all named after inspirational people who have demonstrated our values and contributed positively to society. These Houses become our students' families within our Lowry community and students compete to earn House points by living our academy values and through House challenges and competitions


Each House has a House Captain who is a member of staff and students can become House Leaders to assist the house captain with organising and leading house activities. To achieve these positions, they apply and are then selected by their peers through a democratic vote.



ACES Programme

For our most able students we offer Lowry ACES - our Academic Excellence Stream. The aim of this initiative is to ensure that, we push our most able students to achieve academic excellence. We want to go beyond the traditional curriculum and ensure our students have the depth of knowledge and cultural capital required to gain places at some of the country's top colleges and universities, and we feel that by offering an enhanced curriculum, we will allow our students to compete with some of their grammar and privately educated peers. We also feel that the opportunities provided in the Lowry ACES will broaden students' horizons and give them opportunities they may not normally receive.

The programme offers a range of co-curricular programmes for Years 7-10, all designed to develop not only students' traditional academic development but their wider social development, such as analytical, verbal reasoning and debating skills. The programme lasts for the entire academic year, and culminates in a Celebration Evening, with students, parents and carers invited to join together to celebrate all the hard work and dedication their child has shown

SEND Vision & Aims

The vision and aims of our SEND (Special Educational Needs Department) are:

- All children and young people are valued equally and have the right to learn, achieve and participate fully in education and in the wider community regardless of their abilities and behaviours.
- All children and young people are empowered so that their voice is heard and heeded in decisions made about themselves.
- All parents and carers are partners in meeting the needs of their children.
- All children and young people are entitled to have access to a broad, balanced, and relevant curriculum that is differentiated to meet individual learning styles, recognising personal strengths and needs.
- The diversity of the needs of children and young people is recognised and met through a range of flexible, responsive, and varied provision.

The Lowry Academy's SENCO (Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator) is Mrs Jennifer Travis.

English as an Additional Language (EAL)

At The Lowry Academy, we have a rich multicultural diversity with almost 170 students coming directly from other countries and a further 70 of international heritage speaking a variety of over 50 languages. We promote and celebrate different cultures throughout the year marking all world event days such as Refugee Week, Black History Month and World Language Days with assemblies and related activities.

The EAL Hub is always open providing a friendly pastoral base during break and lunchtimes where students can meet, socialise or simply have a quiet space or reading time in our book corner.

For our students who are new to the English language, we offer a full language assessment and then one-to-one or small group weekly intervention classes with our EAL specialist tutors. This is complemented by a range of support at all levels for all EAL learners including online booster tutorials, in-class support and after-school clubs for homework and course catch-up.

Pastoral and Safeguarding

The Lowry Academy is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all its students. This responsibility necessitates a child protection policy and robust procedures. Each student's welfare is of paramount importance. Our Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy can be found on our website.

Where there are concerns about a child's welfare, the school will contact appropriate agencies, share information with them, and work in partnership with them. Concerns will be discussed with the family if it will not place the child at risk of significant harm. The child's view will also be considered in deciding whether to inform the family in some circumstances, particularly where the child is sufficiently mature to make informed judgements. The interest of the child is paramount.

Celebrating Success

At The Lowry Academy, we have a positive culture. We focus on the positive behaviour and praise, celebrate and reward students for demonstrating these behaviours. Developing a positive learning environment and good learning habits are rooted in United Learning and The Lowry Academy values. Students who make good choices around positive learning behaviour will be rewarded.

Students will receive rewards in several ways:

• House Points are given daily in lessons by teachers for students demonstrating our values and having an excellent attitude to their learning.

 Students will also be awarded House Points for representing their Academy House in competitive events such as sport fixtures, interhouse sports and academic competitions.

 Students can also receive House Points throughout each day for demonstrating the Academy Values of Aspiration, Respect, Confidence, Creativity and Resilience.


The Lowry Way

House Points feed into our Lowry Excellence Booklets.

Students who achieve bronze, silver and gold status receive prizes, treats and attend reward events such as a trip to the cinema, bowling, crazy golf, or other activities brought to school, such as teambuilding activities, inflatables, laser tag etc.

Other Reward Opportunities

- Students who have 100% weekly attendance will receive a token to enter our Attendance Raffle. Various prizes are up for grabs when the Raffle is drawn at the end of each term.
- Every lesson, one student is selected by the class teacher and rewarded with a Golden Ticket to recognise their effort and attitude to learning. These can be traded for prizes or used to collect platinum tickets!
- Postcards/emails will be sent home from Teachers, Senior Leaders or the Principal.
- We host a rewards assembly each term for each year group where students receive certificates and badges for subject recognition, values awards and Aspire attendance.
- At the end of each full-term, badges will be awarded for a full term of 100% attendance, subject recognition, values and bronze, silver, gold.


