



Principal's Notes

Dear Families,

I hope you are well. I'm beginning this week's letter with a plea for help. You will read in this week's communications that we are looking for parents or guardians who are fluent in Portuguese, Urdu, Persian (Farsi and Dari), or Cantonese, who would be willing to assist us in conducting some GCSE speaking exams in these languages. If you may be able to help, please see the letter in this week's mailing and contact Mrs Gallagher.

What's going on in school this week?

Today, our Year 7 and 8 students enjoyed an assembly delivered by BAE and the Royal Navy. It was a fantastic experience—please ask your child about the robot dog they saw!

Year 9 students have recently attended GCSE taster subject sessions, and our Options booklet will be published soon to support them in making their choices. As I write this on Thursday, we are preparing for our Year 10 Parents' Evening later today. Meanwhile, our Year 11 students are busy revising for their mock exams, which will take place after half-term. During the half-term break, 28 students and 3 staff members will be heading off to Barcelona, Spain, for an exciting school trip. We wish them all a fantastic time and look forward to hearing about their experiences when they return.

Term-Time Holidays

With the half term coming up you may be considering booking a holiday. If you are, I hope you have a fantastic time, but politely ask that your child does not take additional days at the start of next half term to extend the holiday. I want to remind all families that parents and carers do not have the right to take their children out of school during term time and may be fined if holidays are taken without the school's consent. If you are thinking about taking your child out of school for a family holiday, you must notify me in writing. Please note that, unless there are exceptional circumstances, such requests will not be authorised, and this could lead to a fixed penalty notice being issued.

A fixed penalty notice works similarly to a parking ticket, where the costs escalate if not paid promptly. The fine is £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid within 28 days. The Local Authority decides when to issue fines, but under national rules, all schools must consider a fine when a child has missed 10 or more sessions (5 days) for unauthorised reasons. If a parent receives a second fine for the same child within a three-year period, the fine increases to £160. To avoid this, I urge families to book holidays during school breaks only.

Vaping

Finally, I've spoken to a couple of parents recently about 'vaping'. I want to remind all parents that vapes are banned in school. Vaping poses serious health risks to young people, as it can harm lung development and lead to nicotine addiction. Many vaping products contain high levels of nicotine or other unknown chemicals, which can impact concentration, memory, and overall well-being. Additionally, the long-term effects of vaping are still not fully understood, but early studies suggest potential links to respiratory issues. Additionally, it is illegal for individuals under the age of 18 to vape in the UK. This includes the use, possession, and purchase of vaping products. The law aims to protect minors from the potential health risks of vaping underage and to prevent the start of nicotine use at a young age.

For these reasons, vapes should not be brought into school and will be confiscated if seen.

Year 9 DTP Immunisations

Dear Parent / Carer,

We have been asked by the Salford 0-19 Immunisations Team to share the following information with families regarding the immunisations for Year 9 students on 10th February 2025.



<u>3-in-1 Teenage Booster (DTP) and Meningitis ACWY</u> are usually offered to children in Yr 9 approx. age 13-14. The teenage booster, also known as the 3-in-1 or the Td/IPV vaccine, is given to boost protection against 3 separate diseases: Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio. The MenACWY vaccine protects against 4 strains of the meningococcal bacteria – A, C, W and Y – which cause meningitis and blood poisoning (septicaemia).

The 0-19 Immunisations team alongside the school Nurses are working in partnership with your child's school to deliver these high school age vaccinations. These vaccinations are not routinely offered at GP practices. All Immunisations are extremely important and ensure that your child is protected later in life, the DTP and MenACWY vaccinations are given alongside each other and will be offered to your child, in school by nurses.

If your child is not immunised during this session, please be assured that they will be seen at the catch up session.

We would ask parents / carers to ensure that students are wearing a short-sleeved T-shirt underneath their school shirts if possible, or to wear a short-sleeved shirt.

Options for School Leavers with SEND

Dear Parent / Carer,

Salford Information Advice and Support Services (SIASS) have asked us to share the following information with families regarding education and training after GCSE's for school leavers with SEND:

SIASS and the Skills and Work Team will be hosting another session for parents and carers of children and young people with SEND (including those with and without EHCPs) who are interested in exploring what options are available when they leave Year 11. This session is ideal for those Year 9 and above, and also those who may have left school already but want to see what other options are available.

The sessions will go through all the different available courses across Salford and just beyond, with an emphasis on those options for those with SEND. There will be a presentation and then an opportunity to ask questions. SIASS can explain any procedures or processes, whereas the Skills and Work Team will provide course specific information.


This is an ideal time, particularly for those who are in Year 11 or Year 13 with EHCPs, who should be having their statutory Annual Reviews with a view to transition but is open to <u>ALL</u> young people with SEND. The session is being run <u>ONLINE</u> on <u>Thursday 13th February, 9.30am-11am</u>, on <u>Microsoft Teams</u>. If you want to attend you must book on by e-mailing <u>SIASS@salford.gov.uk</u>. Please ensure you provide:

Child's full name;
Date of birth;
Parent's name;
Telephone and e-mail address;
School setting;
Whether or not they have an EHCP;
Brief description of their SEND.

(Without this your booking will not be confirmed).

There will also be an <u>IN-PERSON</u> session on Thursday 13th February, 6pm-7pm, at Swinton Gateway (100 Chorley Road, Swinton, M27 6BP). Bookings are not required, just turn up. Young people are also free to attend as well.







Annual Review Training for Parents and Carers

Salford Information Advice and Support Services (SIASS) have asked us to inform parents about their annual review training for parents. Please see the details below:

SIASS are holding annual review training for parents and carers. This training session will be held online via **Microsoft Teams** on **Tuesday 11th February 2025 at 6-8pm**, and again at **8-10pm**.

This online training will go over the statutory processes around Annual Reviews of the EHCP. This is for any parent or carer who has a child or young person with an EHCP, or is going through the EHCP process. This is useful because if your child has an EHC plan, your local authority has a legal duty to review and amend the plan when your child moves between particular stages of education. The deadlines for when your child's EHC plan must be reviewed and amended are:

- 31 March for those moving from secondary school to a post-16 institution
- 15 February for all other phases of transfer.

Please choose your time: 6pm-8pm, or 8pm-10pm. You only need to attend one session as they are the same.

You will receive a link closer to the time once your booking is confirmed.
